Dear Shareholder,

During the second quarter of 2017, the Osterweis Strategic Income Fund (the Fund) generated a total return of 1.58%, compared to 1.45% for the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Bond Index (BC Agg). The Fund's annualized total returns over the one year, five year and ten year periods ending June 30, 2017 were 9.85%, 5.07% and 6.02%, respectively, compared to -0.31%, 2.21% and 4.48% for the BC Agg over the same periods.

As discussed in our Investment Outlook, on the surface there are mixed signals in the market that are confusing for investors. Both "risk on" and "risk off" assets have risen in the first half of the year. While that seems to fly in the face of logic, if you look deeper it appears that "risk off" assets are being driven by asset flows rather than a deteriorating economic environment. We believe we are still in a slow growth, low inflation environment that is supported by an improving global economic backdrop.

Our focus remains on shorter duration, higher yielding bonds based on our belief that economic sensitivity is preferable to interest rate sensitivity in today's market. We have added to our convertible holdings and will opportunistically add more when we see attractive prices. Finally, our meaningful cash cushion should provide us with dry powder during bouts of volatility.
